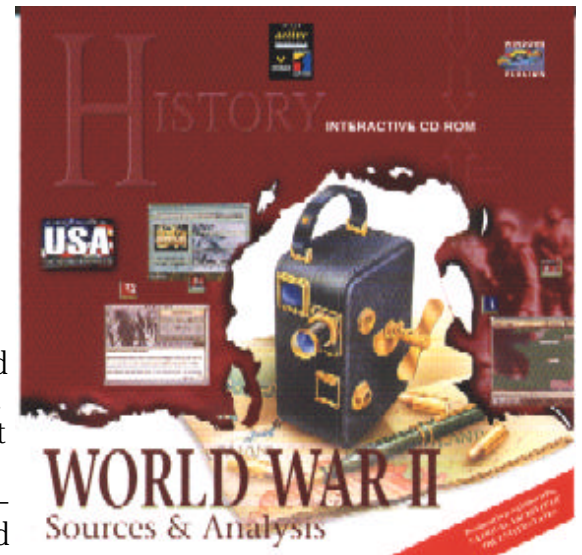

Teacher notes

This networkable CD-Rom may prove to be particularly useful. Suitable for Years 10-11, the information provided could be used both for discovery source based exercises and revision exercises. The 'Themes' section fits into the GCSE scheme of work, as it covers specific areas such as the Atom Bomb and the Holocaust. These 'themes' have a great deal of information, and if the CD-Rom is used in a networked environment, pupils could be divided up and given different tasks. The advantage of using the CD-Rom on a network is that set tasks can be more open, allowing more pupil investigation and discovery, as well as developing skills of utilising evidence and appreciating relevance. Other CD-Rom activities for stand alone computers need to be more closed simply because of the constraints of time and number of pupils.



Example: The Holocaust

- When the program is loaded, the main screen appears. On this, click 
- The themes section provides pupils with five choices – African Americans, Propaganda, Atom Bomb, D-Day and The Holocaust.
- For this example, click **THE HOLOCAUST**
- A new screen appears, offering Holocaust related material:

Nazi racism and the origins of racial war

Anti-Semitism

The mass extermination of the Jews

The Wannsee Conference

The Holocaust and the War

- Pupils could be directed to investigate one of these areas individually or in groups of 2-3 (depending on computers).

The CD-Rom is quite user friendly, so pupils are able to spend time researching and investigating their designated areas, as well as the links to other areas.

Preparations (N.B. Instructions to not necessarily apply on all networks)

1. Put the CD-Rom into the CD drive, and a start-up screen should appear:
2. Simply click on RUN
3. The instructions provided above then apply.
